



### China to Invest \$97 Billion AUD to Improve Internet in Rural Areas

China today said it would invest \$97 billion AUD to

increase Internet speeds and expand broadband access in rural areas by this year, as the country strives to boost growth by unleashing the potential of its more than

648 million web users.


According to guidelines issued by the Chinese central cabinet, China plans to spend more than 430 billion yuan (\$97 billion

AUD) in 2015 and more than 700 billion yuan (\$152)

**DILION** AUD) total in 2016 and 2017 on Internet infrastructure. The guidelines said China will accelerate building of high-speed broadband networks and improve Internet access in more than 14,000 villages by the end of 2015.


